## Consent Resolution Number 2013-01 The Ceres Gleann Homeowners Association, Inc. Policy on Backyard Landscape Rules for Golf Course Lots

## **EXHIBIT A**

## PROPOSED BACKYARD LANDSCAPE RULE FOR GOLF COURSE LOTS

- All backyards shall only include vegetation that is of a proper scale for the affected lot. That is to say, trees, at maturity, will not grow taller than 15-20' as identified in the species characteristics. Shrubs and flowers shall not intrude into a neighbor's lot or lean against the neighbor's house.
- All trees shall be pruned to be free of foliage and branches from ground level up to a height of 5 ½ feet. A lot owner, with the approval of immediately adjacent lot owners, can exempt specific trees from this pruning requirement.
- Consistent with 1 and 2 above, lot owners shall be entitled to develop plantings of their choosing. However, immediately adjacent lot owners shall be entitled to an unobstructed view of the golf course as measured by sight lines that extend on a straight angle from the midpoint of the back of the home of each resident to the left and right southern property corners.
- In the event a golf course lot owner believes that the landscaping of a neighboring lot owner interferes with his or her protected views, the neighbors shall confer and attempt to reach an amicable resolution.

If the neighbors fail to reach resolution, either party may bring the matter to the Landscape Committee. The Landscape Committee will review the matter and issue a finding.
